2022-23 SCHOOL PROFILE (CLASS OF 2023)

THE SCHOOL

Marlborough College, founded in 1843, is a highly regarded, nationally and internationally sought-after co-educational, full boarding school. We are situated 75 miles west of London in the charming market town of Marlborough. The 1012 students who are currently enrolled, grades 8-12, live in 16 boarding houses situated on an extensive campus. Marlborough offers the GCSE and GCE A level curriculum.

OUR MISSION

To deliver the best independent, co-educational, full boarding education in the UK and to be recognised for this globally. Set in a beautiful environment steeped in history, it is a welcoming community where ambition and scholarship are highly valued, creativity is celebrated, diversity is embraced and where each pupil is encouraged and challenged to be the best that they can be.

OUR VALUES

Ambition, community, service and initiative: these are the values that form the strong foundation of our boarding school and enable everyone to contribute, to feel valued and to fulfil their potential.

CURRICULUM ROUTES

Lower School (Grades 8,9 & 10)

Shell (8) – Broad based curriculum, which includes Mathematics, Science, Form (an innovative integrated Humanities course), Languages and Geography.

Remove (9) & Hundred (10) – A core of compulsory subjects plus a choice of up to five more from a wide range of options. A typical pupil will take 9 (I)GCSEs with the option of additional subjects such as Astronomy (we have an Observatory on-site), Latin, Greek and additional Languages and Arts subjects. (I)GCSE exams are completed at the end of the Summer Term of the Hundred (10) year.

Upper School (Grades 11 & 12)

Lower Sixth (11) and Upper Sixth (12) – Marlborough is a single-track system where all pupils now take A level. Pupils can choose to study 3 or 4 subjects. 13% graduated in 2022 with 4 subjects (UK universities require just 3 subjects). In addition, pupils can undertake the highly prized Extended Project Qualification (EPQ) and additional courses such as Creative Writing.

CURRICULUM CALENDAR

The College runs on a Trimester system with courses rotating on a two-week block cycle, with 55-minute periods, six days a week.

GRADING SYSTEM

Pupils take public examinations at the end of their sophomore year ((I)GCSEs). They take senior year (GCE A level) public examinations at the end of the Upper Sixth (12).

INFORMATION PROVIDED IN TRANSCRIPTS

Final (I)GCSE exam grades will be shown with number grades (1-9). A grid is shown on each transcript to assist readers.

Predicted A level grades will show a letter grade (A*-E).

MIDYEAR grades are used at the end of January to indicate current progress or any change to the Predicted Grade. **FINAL** grades are not available until August after the pupil graduates.

STATEMENT ON CLASS RANK

Marlborough College does not calculate class rank or grade point average; instead academic achievement is reported through the public examination results. We do not 'rate' our students on the Common Application.

GRADUATION

This depends upon the completion of 3 A level examinations. Examination results become available circa. 15th August in 2023.

ACADEMIC EXTENSION – COMPLEMENTARY COURSES

At Lower Sixth, beyond the three or four main A level subjects, pupils have the option to study one 'extra', as part of our commitment to helping pupils discover new passions or feed existing ones. These include the Extended Project Qualification, Creative Writing AFA, and a number of (I)GCSE language options.

EXTENDED PROJECT QUALIFICATION (EPQ)

Now entering its tenth full year, it is offered to both Upper and Lower Sixth pupils as an extra qualification. The EPQ is 100% coursework, internally marked and externally moderated. It is A level standard (graded up to A*) but worth the UCAS points of an AS level.

(I)GCSEs

A two-year course examined at the end of Hundred (10). Pupils normally take 9 or more subjects including English Language and Literature, a foreign language, Mathematics and two or three sciences. The results in the two tables here are for 2021 (the cohort of pupils now in year 12).

A level & Pre-U

A two-year course examined at the end of Upper Sixth (12). Pre-U courses will not be offered from the academic year 2022-23.

The grades shown in the table below refer to 2019 results. This is the most useful and consistent benchmark when exams were taken in normal circumstances (pre COVID).

In 2019, 45% of our A level/Pre-U results were graded A* or A (D1-D3), 79% A*/A or B (D1-M2) and 99% graded A to D (D1-P2).

EPQ

In 2021/22, 100 pupils in the Upper Sixth carried out the EPQ with 48 A*, 27 A, 18 B, 6 C and 1 D grades awarded.

Standardised Testing

Testing Restrictions on international students & US citizens abroad:

In recent years, our students have had less access to SAT/SAT Subject and ACT tests because of fewer test dates abroad, fewer sites offering the test, score cancellations and higher fees. We ask that all higher education institutions take this into account when evaluating our pupils' applications.

Access to testing has been extremely difficult this year.

Standardised testing is not supported within the curriculum. However, we became an ACT test centre in September 2016 and are now offering ACT CBT testing.
